Rabbi Pearl

THE HOLIEST DAYS of the year are upon us. Rosh HaShanah and Yom Kippur are the days of fate and renewal, where our destiny is decided and where we have the opportunity to shape that destiny through prayer and repentance. These are holidays of celebration, of gathering with friends, of holiday meals, synagogue services, and of greetings and good wishes. How do we make it count? How do we shape these precious days into the tools that can change our lives?

As I write these words, Israel and Jews throughout the world are contemplating the indecisive results of the latest elections. Once again, there is no clearcut winner, and once again whoever manages to wheel and deal best in the maze of Israeli politics will assume power. Why all this confusion? Why can't Israelis make up their minds and pick a leader?

Israelis are no different from Jews anywhere else in the world. They disagree fiercely, and have trouble coming to a decisive conclusion. I hope and pray that a good leader and a steady base emerg from these days of confusion

I believe that our issue with Rosh HaShanah and Yom Kippur is the same as the Israeli electorate. We can't make up our minds. Do we want to be more religious or less? More careful of our observance of mitzvot, or less restrained in what we do, eat, or think? Are we a separate community, or do we want to be involved in the activities and faith of our neighbors? Do we believe in the Torah, or in the words of "Porgy and Bess," think that "it ain't necessarily so"?

If you want these Days of Awe to really mean something, you have to make up your mind. You have to decide the kind of Jew you want to be, what you believe, how to increase your knowledge base. That's what B'nai Israel is here for. Every time that you walk Continued on page 2
